Introduction – Debbie Morrison asked all attendees to introduce themselves and include the street they live on.

Treasurer's Report – Jerry Giles - \$3115 in account.

- Dumpster Day we had \$1413 budgeted and spent \$1144
- Dues to date for 2011 are \$330

- Clean-up day on 3/19. Jerry will chair event. Budget: \$267. Volunteer hrs: 120 budgeted
- Ewaste to be held on May 21st. Event is not limited to those living in our neighborhood. Suggestion given to advertise in Pennysaver. Volunteer hours: 25 budgeted. Jerry will be the chairperson for this event.

CAP 25 – Grant approval deadline is February 23rd. Board decided on a max of four events.

Additional suggestions discussed;

- Village Harvest – donation of fruit from neighborhood fruit trees
- Christmas trees on lawns similar to Willow Glen
- Car show at the ICC. LNA could sell drinks and hot dogs to raise funds at event
- Mike suggested a community vegetable garden on the ICC grounds. Would need to run this by Pastor's before moving forward with feasibility and needs

District 1 City Council Report – Stephanie Morrison

- Budget Deficit for Fiscal Year 2011-2012 expected to be \$90 million. Pete believes amount could be as high as \$112 million
- Based on upcoming Census results, District 1 may go past Winchester

- Debbie – moving forward, we will not have a speaker each month
- Debbie – Would like to move from paper flyers to email to reduce waste
- Clark suggested we start NNO planning in June. Debbie suggested we use LNA meetings to address some areas of NNO
