- Council attempting to resolve \$118 million budget deficit crisis.
- Negotiations with unions continue.

- A few National Night Out information sheets were distributed.
- Elizabeth made some suggestions about appropriate contacts for graffiti removal in response to Jerry Giles' concerns re bus stop bench graffiti.

Treasurer's Report - Jerry Giles

\$1863.23 in account. Still waiting for the \$2700 CAP grant check for cycle 24 beginning in July. Suggestions made for spending the remaining \$124 from this year's CAP grant included paper supplies, water and napkins for meeting refreshments. Five households paid dues since last meeting.

Committee Reports

Winchester NAC – Clark Leakins. Proposed community center closings will require reorganization and more sharing between organizations. Landlord barbeque planned for Cadillac Dr. area to improve neighborhood. A color news letter has been developed which may serve as a prototype. If we are to help distribute it, Debbie wants to be sure that we can put our information in it, and also that it be given to us in time to distribute with our flyer.

Blackford NAC – Mary Ann West. Starbird, West Valley and Kirk community centers may be closing due to the budget crisis. The Starbird youth program may move to the Cypress Senior Center.

Traffic Committee – Debbie Morrison and Mohamed Alozzah. Several new school crossing signs have been posted, and Shearton and Coakley are being studied by the Department of Transportation for traffic concerns. Sue McMillin brought up a concern about streets being blocked at the time children are picked up after school.

LERT Committee – Leadership needed for disaster preparedness.
